The Fisher Foundation for Hearing Health Care, founded by Dr. Ronna Fisher, Au.D., has been providing hearing services, treatment and hearing aids to anyone in need since 2005

The treatment that saves the lives of children with brain cancer, chemotherapy and radiation, causes permanent hearing loss in nearly 70% of those that survive.

Children are in the peak of their learning period. They learn by hearing and imitating their teachers, peers and family. Lack of treatment results in learning and cognitive delays, low self-confidence, difficulty socializing and limited career choices. They will never reach their full potential.

Time is of the essence!

Hearing aids are the only treatment. They are expensive and not covered by insurance. Families, overwhelmed with medical expenses, have nowhere to turn for guidance, support or financial help.

Riley Buckholz was six years old when he was diagnosed with brain cancer in 2014. His family was devastated and overwhelmed. Riley spent the next 18 months in and out of the hospital. Care and arrangements for his siblings, transportation, medical decisions re treatment options, and the mounting expenses and medical bills were emotionally and physically stressful. Even worse was watching their child in pain while their ability to comfort and communicate with him became increasingly difficult due to the hearing damage caused by the treatment. They could not afford the only thing that would help. Hearing aids.

The Buckholzs reached out to the Fisher Foundation. Setbacks and re-hospitalizations delayed help and treatment for nearly six months.

Finally, in August 2015, Riley was well enough to come home. The Fisher Foundation arranged a special surprise the day he got his hearing aids. Batman, Riley's favorite hero, was there to greet him and give him special batman presents.

Riley's mom, Adena, said it was the happiest day they had since the diagnosis. When Riley grinned and said, "I can hear you now mommy. Say I love you again," she cried with joy. So did everyone in the room.
